

Reflections on Readings for the First Sunday of Advent

"The Days Are Coming, Says The Lord, When I Will Fulfill My Promise"

This is the first Sunday of our new liturgical year - a time of anticipation and a new fresh start in our relationship with the Lord.



For the next four weeks, our readings will focus on three things - God's promise from ancient times for a Messiah, anticipation of God's promises kept at Christmas as God Himself comes to live among us, and God's promise of Jesus' second coming when our "redemption is at hand."

The words of the prophet Jeremiah in our first

reading (JER 33:14–16), offered hope to the Jewish people in exile in Babylon. He prophesied God's promise of the restoration of Jerusalem and that an heir to the throne of David ("A Just Shoot") would one day reign as king forever. If there is one thing the Jewish people knew, it was that God keeps His promises.

In our Epistle reading (Thessalonians 3:12 - 4:2),

St. Paul gives us advice on how to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord. This advice holds true for both the first coming of Christ at Christmas and for His second coming at the end of time. This advice is perhaps something parents today could write in a Christmas letter to their own children — "May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we have for you."

In our Gospel reading (Luke 21:25-28, 34-36), Jesus described a time of tribulation when the final judgement would come and Jesus would return. But for the faithful and vigilant ones, "stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." In other words, the end times should not be a frightful time for the faithful, but a time to look forward to our redemption.

This Advent season is a time of looking to the past and looking to the future with the purpose of influencing our present. Just as Jesus comes into the world anew at Christmas, so too He comes anew into our hearts. This is a time of preparation for that glorious event.



Happy Advent!

Advent is my favorite liturgical season. This isn't surprising, because I love looking forward to good things. It also is surprising, because I hate waiting. Yes, I'm aware that doesn't make any sense! I suppose because I am not a patient person, I don't like just waiting without anything to do or control. And I don't like waiting for news that might be negative, or to be disappointed when a good thing doesn't happen.

Advent is the perfect balance. It is the peace of a pause, but it's not the nothingness of just waiting. It is the chance to look forward: to prepare, to plan, to seek out Christ – in its peace, it is not passive.

And the promise of Advent is always fulfilled: Christmas always comes. Christ is always born. Christ is always here! I've had Christmases where bad things happened. I've had strep, chicken pox, and the flu. My husband often works Christmas Eve and Christmas Day shifts. My kids have been overwhelmed by the activity. There was the grief of a first Christmas without my mother, and a first Christmas without my father. Even still, Christ is always born. Even if it is mixed with the "anxieties of daily life" from today's Gospel reading, there is always joy and love.

I don't meant to dismiss the reality of pain or hardships, especially those things that sting a little extra during the holidays. I mean to pray that you and any children you care for find the peace you need this Advent season. It helps me find that peace to know Christ, the joy and love we receive in the Eucharist, and the joy and love we share with our communities and loved ones - these will be enough for me on Christmas. (I should work on that the rest of the year!)

May you have "enough" for peace! May you have enough food, shelter, and love this Advent. May all children have enough food, shelter, and love, always.
